Chief Yon also mentioned that Mike Zacharias, Extreme Tool and Engineering, is working with the Fire Department to enhance the Fire Departments ability to locate potentially hazardous materials within a structure by having a flash drive located in a lock box on the exterior of their buildings and supplying a vehicle laptop for our Fire Truck. This system will also be useful at vehicle accidents. The Fire Department voted in a new member, Mr. Nick Tarro, who will receive necessary training in the near future. No action was taken. Mayor DelFavero thanked the Fire Department for all their efforts.

b) Merit Network (Fiber Optic Internet)- After a lengthy discussion Granato moved, Tarro seconded, CARRIED, that the Council table any action on installing Fiber Optic Cable at the Wakefield Municipal Building until more information is received.

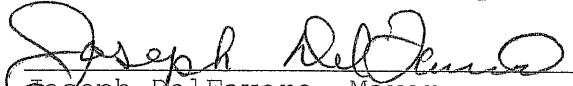

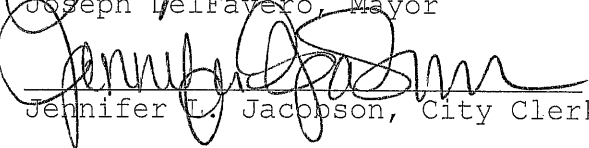

c) Gogebic Range Water Authority Resolution- Granato moved, Wiita seconded, that the Council adopt a Resolution authorizing the GRWA to sell a Revenue Bond, which is required because the City of Wakefield is a member of the GRWA. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.

d) 2017-2018 Fiscal Year Budget Worksession- Granato moved, Wiita seconded, CARRIED, that the Council schedule a Budget Worksession for Thursday, March 16, 2017 at 3:00 P.M.

e) Michigan State Extension Office- Planning/Zoning Workshop- Wiita moved, Mann seconded, that any members of the Council and Planning Commission be authorized to attend the April 18, 2017 workshop in Bessemer at a cost of \$65.00 per person. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.

f) Eugene Maki Day- Granato moved, Mann seconded, that the City declare March 14, 2017 as Eugene Maki Day in the City of Wakefield and publish a Notice acknowledging the many years of dedicated service Mr. Maki provided to the City over they years. Motion CARRIED, all voting yes by roll call vote.

Neil Londo commented on the Gogebic Range Water Authority resolution and water rates. Andy Hill thanked the Council for remembering Mr. Eugene Maki.


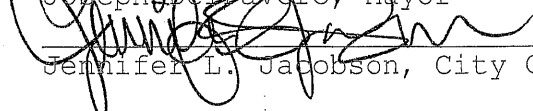
